Education Support Partnership (ESP)

The Foundation is dedicated to enabling students to achieve their individual potentials. Its focus is the residents of the West Branch-Rose City Area Schools.

SECTION I

Introduction to Scholarships

You have made an important decision to attend college and further your education. You are to be congratulated. It is the intent of this booklet to help guide you through the process of applying for college and to help you with this expensive endeavor.

College Entrance

Realize there will be an application fee for most schools. In October, some colleges waive the fee.

- 1. Note all deadlines and finish applications one-two weeks prior to deadlines to allow time to obtain transcripts and written recommendations.
- 2. Respond to all items on applications to avoid delays.
- 3. Indicate your interest in financial aid by checking the appropriate blank on the applications.
- 4. Understand that most colleges and universities will not consider you for campus-based financial aid until you have been offered admission.
- 5. If you have borderline grades for the college you plan to attend, it is best to apply early in September and apply to a back-up college as well.

Tips for writing applications:

- 1. Make a good first impression! Your application may be your only opportunity. Take the time to do it well.
- 2. Print the application and use the copy to practice. Keep the copy for reference.
- 3. Type whenever possible; if using longhand be neat and use black or blue ink.
- 4. Prepare a rough draft of any essays, then revise and refine the content. Proofread for spelling, grammar and punctuation errors. Keep a copy of your final draft. You may wish to revise/alter/expand/reduce it for other college or scholarship applications.

In October, Ogemaw Heights High School has a financial aid workshop for parents and students. A financial aid officer from a college or community college, or the High School Counselor, will present an overview of the different types of aid available. The Free Application for Financial Student Aide (FAFSA) form will be available to parents at this workshop.

Types of Financial Aid

There are three primary types of financial aid:

- Scholarships and grants usually do not have to be repaid. Scholarships are awarded on merit, and grants are usually awarded on the basis of need.
- Loans are an advance of funds which must be repaid over a period of years with interest.
- Work/study programs provides jobs for students who need financial aid. Federal funds are awarded to a college or university for this program, and its financial aid office administers the funds. The amount of each award depends on the student's need and the funds available. Work/study may be part of a financial aid package.

Sources of Scholarships and Grants

1. Colleges and Universities

Check colleges f inancial aid bulletins and catalogs for scholarships for which you may qualify. Grants may be incorporated into the college's financial aid package.

2. Michigan Competitive Scholarship Program

Michigan students who plan to attend Michigan public and private colleges are eligible for this program. The first step in the application process is to take the American College Test (ACT). Students who obtain a qualifying score must then file the FAFSA and qualify for financial aid.

3. Community Organizations

Foundations, trusts, corporations, business organizations, service clubs, labor unions, religious groups, and community groups offer various amounts of financial aid. Section II of this booklet describes scholarships available from local sources.

4. Pell Grants

This federal program for undergraduates only makes awards based on demonstrated need. Eligibility is determined by a standard formula. Students automatically apply for this when they fill out the FAFSA

5. Supplemental Educational Opportunities Grants (SEOG)

These federal grants are for undergraduate students with the greatest financial need. This program is administered by the financial aid officer at each college.

- 6. Michigan Tuition Grant (Described in Section II)
- 7. Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) Program

This competitive scholarship program includes a commitment to the military. The process needs to begin in the junior year.

Sources for Loans

Loans are available. Generally, loans based on the FAFSA are desirable because they have low interest rates, require no collateral, and repayment usually begins following graduation. Because most of these loan programs are funded or guaranteed by federal or state monies, they are subject to change and therefore few details are included here. Request copies of "Who Says You Can't: Financial Aid for Study After High School" published by the Michigan State Board of Education and "The Student Guide" published by the US Department of education. Both may be available in your high school's counseling center.

Miscellaneous

Combining Education and Work through Cooperative Education

Some colleges and universities incorporate a work experience into the curriculum in certain fields. After the first year of on-campus study, students alternate periods of work and study. This cooperative education experience often extends the amount of time needed to complete an undergraduate degree by one year, but the student gains valuable on the job experience. While this option may be a source of additional income, investigate the expenses associated with off campus-living.

Reminders

- 1. Realize that independently awarded scholarships often reduce other contributions in a financial aid package rather than reducing the family contribution. The family contribution can remain constant.
- 2. **THINK TWICE** before paying a company to match you with scholarships. There are not that many scholarships available which are unrestricted.
- 3. **DO** check the financial aid box on the college applications indicating your interest. Many schools are able to offer assistance to students.
- 4. **DO** mark your calendar and meet all deadlines. In some instances the "early bird does get the better worm".
- 5. **DO** complete all applications accurately the first time to avoid delays or disqualifications.
- 6. **DO** urge your parents to complete federal and state income tax returns as early as possible in the new calendar year if you want to be considered for financial aid from the schools which offer admission.
- 7. **DO** check on the availability of scholarships offered by professional and service organizations to which your parents belong.
- 8. **DO** make photocopies of your completed college applications and FAFSA forms. Filling out the FAFSA on-line is much faster than the traditional paper form.
- 9. **DO** take advantage of the financial aid sessions at College Night and any special college Financial Aid Workshop sponsored by your school.
- 10. **DO** investigate the information on the Web, videotapes and computer programs which can assist you in completing financial aid forms or applications and are available in your counseling center.

Tests

Most colleges and universities will require the results of one national test the American College Testing Program-(ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). Since the ACT is the test of choice for the state scholarship programs for Michigan, most Michigan schools accept and/or prefer this test. Ogemaw Heights High School is one of the national test sites for the ACT. The ACT test is administered in October, April and June at OHHS. The best time for students to take the ACT is in the spring of their junior year. It can then be taken in the fall of their senior year if the score needs to be raised. The ACT test cost a nominal fee, and students need to register four-six weeks prior to the test. Registration materials can be obtained from your counselor.

Financial Aid Criteria

If you desire financial aid, you must check the appropriate item on each college application. Most colleges will then require a parent's confidential financial statement to determine your "need'. Parents complete one document which is analyzed and the results are forwarded to the agencies and the college financial aid offices that you specify. There is a no charge for this service. Some colleges may require that you complete their financial aid form as well. Each college then puts together a "financial aid package" which is offered to you. This financial aid package can include any combination of scholarship, grant, loan and work/study support.

"Need" does not mean that you are poor; it is the difference between what it costs to attend a particular college and what your family can afford to contribute toward those costs (the "family contributions").

SECTION II

ESP Scholarships

The descriptions, which follow, provide basic information for each award. The monies available from these awards vary. The announcement of the recipients for the local scholarships will be at the senior awards banquet which is held in May. Here are some helpful hints for your scholarship endeavor.

- ➤ Check with your college or university to see what scholarships they offer.
- > Check with veteran organizations if a parent or grandparent was a veteran. A copy of the honorable discharge papers may be required.
- Check with your parents or your employer to see if they offer a scholarship.
- ➤ Check with your parents unions, social organizations, and church to see if they offer a scholarship.
- > Search the internet sites for occupational scholarships. For example, scholarships offered for students going into the nursing field.
- Scholarships that you qualify for through the State of Michigan may require you to communicate back to them, so be vigilant.
- Local scholarship awards may vary from year to year, or may not be offered every year.
- Read the OHHS daily announcements to check for national and college scholarship postings.
- ➤ <u>To Be Announced (TBA)</u> indicates that the scholarship deadline date will be posted in the spring in the counseling center.
- > Be Mindful of deadlines!!!!

The student must be a graduating senior from Ogemaw Heights High School looking to pursue a career in the Build Trades. The student must have a high school GPA of 2.5 or higher.

A scholarship has been established in memory of Jerry Bunch by his family. Applicants must have a planned major in college as being in the field of golf.

This scholarship is offered to any Ogemaw Heights senior that intends on furthering their education in the field of Arts or Music. Primary consideration will be given to students who plan on studying music or art at a Michigan institution of higher learning.

Applicants must be a graduating senior or recent graduate of OHHS. Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher at the end of their 7th semester. Student must have demonstrated an impeccable work ethic.

ESP - Gogarn, Reynold ~ Reynold Gogarn Memorial Scholarship

Criteria for this scholarship is demonstrated scholastic achievement and leadership capabilities. Applications will be available in the spring of the year. A voluntary committee of four is responsible for selecting the candidates. This scholarship is only available to Ogemaw high school graduates. Seniors must have a GPA of 3.5, and college students must have a GPA of 3.0 and attending a four year college or university. This fund is administered by the North Central Michigan Foundation.
