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Ogemaw Heights High School Receives Continuous Accreditation through AdvanceD

OHHS was recently awarded continuing accreditation through the NCA/AdvancEd accreditation organization. This is part of the five year cycle of continual improvement process which Ogemaw Heights has participated in voluntarily since 1987. Accreditation is the recognition that is granted to institutions that continually aspire to meet a set of rigorous standards, utilize feedback from all stakeholder groups, and make changes to instruction and learning environments based on student performance.

The AdvancED model consists of an Internal Review, which is a self-reflection of current practice, and an External Review, which is conducted by an outside team of professional educators and is the culminating activity in the process.
